Greetings from Your Pastor

I hope everyone has not tired of the stories of the Holy Land. As I have expressed to you, it was a trip of a lifetime. I would love to make the journey again. If there are folks who would like to start the early planning process for a possible trip in early 2015 let me know of your interest and I can start researching our options. If we have extra time to prepare and save for this great opportunity to explore the land where Jesus walked, the stress of preparing is greatly diminished.

As I write this I am preparing for Holy Week observances and thinking back to standing in the Garden of Gethsemane and marveling at the stillness and quiet that fills the place to this day. Even in the midst of a city that has people in the hustle and bustle of their hectic daily routines, calmness fills the place.

As Jesus walked from the home of a certain man as the Bible describes him, along with Peter and the two sons of Zebedee. Jesus just needed a place to pray and spend his final hours on earth in talking to his Abba Father. When he had asked Peter and the two brothers to just stand watch as he prayed, they once again did not grasp the importance of his request. Jesus returned to them three times to ask them to just be there for him. Three times they failed him.

I at times feel like Peter and the two brothers, when I feel God has called me to something and I have fallen asleep. I had not realized what He was up to. I suspect we have all experienced that feeling of letting God down. As Nanci and I got to spend a few moments in quiet reflection in the Garden, I was moved by the sense of peace that I felt. When I read the account of Jesus in the Garden of Gethsemane I get a sense that Jesus was not in a peaceful mood. It tells of Jesus being grieved and agitated. He pleaded with Peter and the others, "I am deeply grieved, even to death; remain and stay awake with me" He did not want to be left alone. And going a little farther, he threw himself on the ground and prayed. My recollection of my mood that day as I sat and prayed for our church, our church family and the ministry here at Lakeside UMC. I get a sense that the agony Jesus felt that night, when he was left alone, when his friends abandoned him, when he had nowhere to turn but back to the Father. Somehow, the agony and torment Jesus experienced that night has been removed from that Holy Place. To be in a place where Jesus spent his last hours on earth in such distress and to feel a sense of calm and peace to me is one of God's miracles. The scene of such deceit and betrayal to our Savior could now be a place of reflection and retreat. My prayer for each of us is that we listen for those pleas from Jesus the Christ. When we are asked to stay awake and be there for someone in need, we would heed the plea. We never know when Jesus will send that plea through someone who crosses our path.

My prayer for each of you is that when our Savior cries out for our hearts, we would be awake to hear it.

Be vigilant for He is coming soon. In the precious love of our Lord Jesus Christ I send you blessings.
