#### **Lay Delegate Annual Conference Report 2013**

It was my privilege to, once again, represent Lakeside UMC at the 2013 Florida Annual Conference in Lakeland, June 13th to 15th. Pastor David and Nanci Branson along with Barbara Russum and Nancy Gettys (both District Lay Delegates) also attended. This year's conference was entitled, "Becoming Disciples of Jesus Christ". The overall theme of the conference was conveyed thru personal testimonies that were given both personally and video throughout the entire event. In previous years, the focus of the conference was often "outward thinking" in terms of missions and our connections to other faiths. But this year the focus really was getting back to the Wesleyan approach which is at the very core of our faith walk as Methodists. Intentional discipleship and Wesleyan Small Groups were large parts of our conversation and it is clear that the new Bishop will be focused on both as we move into the coming years.

Bishop Ken Carter and his wife, Pam, will be an excellent "shot in the arm" for our Florida conference. Everyone that I spoke with agreed there was a certain sense of change in the air causing excitement on the conference level. For her part, Pam Carter has gotten involved with "A Million Reasons" which is a year long mission of the Florida Conference to pack 1,000,000 meals to fight hunger. These meals are packed in an assembly line manner with about 40 volunteers. As the bag is passed along the volunteers pour in the ingredients to create a healthy, hearty meal. The meals can be kept up to two years and cost of \$.25 per meal. During the two day conference, 101,306 bags were prepared. (I think this could be a wonderful mission for Lakeside to get involved with in the coming year!)

Approximately 83% of local churches paid their apportionments 100%. Lakeside UMC was part of that group and I bring a big "Thank You" from the Treasurer for our connectional giving to the Conference.

The highlight of each conference was Friday evening's Ordination, Licensing and Commissioning service. 30 individuals were ordained, commissioned or licensed to go out into our "mission field" and serve.

So, in conclusion, this year's annual conference was not heavy with resolutions or new policies. But rather, a time to look at ourselves as United Methodists and to start re-evaluating our faith walk thru intentional discipleship and focused small groups. We were challenged to come back to our local churches and start a small group and see the difference it would make.



#### Palm Beach County Food Bank

Lakeside has applied to become a partner agency with the Palm Beach County Food Bank. This agency collects and distributes food at no cost to dozens of agencies that feed the hungry. Food distributed includes non-perishable canned and dry goods, refrigerated and frozen product when available and fruit and vegetables. This food can be used for our food pantry, Matthew Meals and even our Vacation Bible School.

Partner agencies must be non-profit organizations with a current tax-exempt 501 (c) 3 status and must have operated a food pantry or meal program for at least 6 months. Other requirements include proof the organizational staff has attended a safe food handling program within 6 months of application approval, agree to an annual visit and inspection by the PB County Food Bank, show proof of regular pest control at the address and in the area where the food is stored. Each time food is given out the total number of households and number of people in a household will be recorded and submitted to the PB County Food Bank to help determine the amount of food Lakeside will receive the next month. At least 2 volunteers must go to the warehouse in Lantana to pick up the food.


