The Book of Matthew recounts Jesus feeding the 5,000 with five loaves of bread and two fish. What a miraculous event that must have been. And we have an opportunity to follow that great example of ministry and outreach. **Stop Hunger Now** is a nonprofit organization that has partnered with the Florida Conference of the United Methodist Church. All across our conference, congregations are hosting meal packaging events and our event is **Saturday, October 17th at 10 AM**.

Have you ever stopped to think what \$1 will buy today? Not much, if you live in our area of the World. If you went to your favorite local grocery store, could you buy enough ingredients to serve a nutritious meal to your whole family for that \$1? How about \$5.....could you feed your whole family a nutritious meal for \$5? Or could you feed 20 people with that \$5? Well guess what?.... You can and you have the opportunity to help families all over the world eat a nutritious meal for \$.25 a meal !

The Stop Hunger Now process can pack 10,000 meals in just one hour! Each meal is "created" and packed in an assembly line fashion with everyone being trained for their specific task. Yes, 10,000 meals sounds like a lot of work but the whole process moves quickly and you will be amazed at how efficient this system is. And you will be doing a worthwhile ministry and outreach program with very little effort by individuals but a mighty effort by our united congregation. We need "all hands on deck" to accomplish our goal and there is something for you to do regardless of your age or physical conditions.

So back to that \$1...that will provide 4 meals and each meal is enough food for four people....so 16 single meals will come from your \$1. If you can't join us for the event, we would ask that you make a donation....any amount will help and we pray for blessings on your gift. Please "earmark" your donations for "Stop Hunger Now" in the memo line of your check or mark as such on offering envelope.

The charge conference is the basic governing body of each United Methodist local church and is composed of all members of the church council. All members of the charge conference must be members of the local church. The charge conference must meet at least once per year. The charge conference directs the work of the church and gives general oversight to the church council, reviews and evaluates the mission and ministry of the church, sets salaries for the pastor and staff, elects the members of the church council, and recommends candidates for ordained ministry.

MEALS ON WHEELS

Do you know someone that cannot shop or prepare hot meals for themselves? The **Meals On Wheels** organization has now expanded to our Lake Osborne area! Meals on Wheels focuses on caring for individuals whose diminished mobility makes it hard to shop for food and prepare meals. Generally, the program serves adults age 60 and over. The program begins via an application and leads to an assessment of the need for meals.

At the core of the **Meals on Wheels** service is a nutritious meal, companionship and a watchful eye on the health and safety of our seniors. Adequate nutrition is necessary for health, functionality and the ability to remain independent. Meals on Wheels ensures that seniors have access to adequate nutrition even when family support, mobility and resources are lacking. For many seniors, the trusted **Meals on Wheels** volunteer who shows up every day with a hot meal and a warm smile is the only person they see or speak with all day. The safety check that accompanies each meal delivery ensures that, in the case of an emergency or problem, medics will be called, families will be notified and our seniors will not be forgotten. Depending on individual circumstances, meals are provided on a sliding fee scale.
