





MEALS ON WHEELS

Do you know someone that cannot shop or prepare hot meals for themselves? The Meals On Wheels organization has now expanded to our Lake Osborne area! Meals on Wheels focuses on caring for individuals whose diminished mobility makes it hard to shop for food and prepare meals. Generally, the program serves adults age 60 and over. The program begins via an application and leads to an assessment of the need for meals.

At the core of the Meals on Wheels service is a nutritious meal, companionship and a watchful eye on the health and safety of our seniors. Adequate nutrition is necessary for health, functionality and the ability to remain independent.

Meals on Wheels ensures that seniors have access to adequate nutrition even when family support, mobility and resources are lacking. For many seniors, the trusted Meals on Wheels volunteer who shows up every day with a hot meal and a warm smile is the only person they see or speak with all day. The safety check that accompanies each meal delivery ensures that, in the case of an emergency or problem, medics will be called, families will be notified and our seniors will not be forgotten. Depending on individual circumstances, meals are provided on a sliding fee scale.
