Lakeside Methodist Church was officially organized and chartered on September 28, 1958

Over the years, Lakeside has been blessed with many pastoral leaders: June 1959, the Rev. John B. Bass and his wife, Mary, were appointed to the Lake Osborne Mission; June 1964, the Rev. David T. Scoates and his wife, Donna; June 1969, the Rev. W. Thomas Parson, Jr. and his wife, Gerrie; June 1976, Rev. Henry Schmidt and his wife, Clare; 1980, Rev. H. Jackson Downey; 1985, Rev. James Maxfield and his wife, Janice; 1989, Rev. David Waller and his wife, Darlene; 1992, Dr. G. Richard Albury and his wife, Katie; June of 1997, Lakeside had it's first female pastor appointed, Rev. Carmen Delker. She married Mr. James Arnett while here and became Rev. Carmen Arnett in 1998; 2004, Pastor Rachel Hollingsworth and her husband, F. Eugene; and last, but not least, Pastor David S. Branson and his wife, Nanci, came to join us in 2011 and are with us in the present day of 2016.

WORLD COMMUNION SUNDAY

Observed on the first Sunday in October, this day calls the Church to be the universal, inclusive Church. The day was first observed by Presbyterians in 1936, adopted by the Federal Council of Churches in 1940, and shortly thereafter observed in Methodist and Evangelical United Brethren churches.

World Communion Sunday is a day when many churches want to emphasize that the body of Christ shares the sacrament in the rich diversity while affirming that "there is one body and one Spirit ... one Lord, one faith, one baptism, one God and Father of us all." (Ephesians 4:4)

Charge Conference? The charge conference is the basic governing body of each United Methodist local church and is composed of all members of the church council. All members of the charge conference must be members of the local church. The charge conference must meet at least once per year. The charge conference directs the work of the church and gives general oversight to the church council, reviews and evaluates the mission and ministry of the church, sets salaries for the pastor and staff, elects the members of the church council, and recommends candidates for ordained ministry.
