Lakeside United Methodist Church History

Did you know? How many of these do you remember?

2013, We said good-bye to the Oakstone Academy Palm Beach School in July and have opened our arms to the Arts and Education International Inc. in September. The new school will be a preschool and they will also hold afterschool care here for the children coming from their other facility.

We said good-bye to our 12 step program AA group due to poor attendance at this location.

Our card writing outreach ministry has been a great blessing to many whether just sick or shut-in and unable to make it to church anymore.

We have changed from a committee system to a Leadership Council.

We continue to strive to build our youth and young adult areas in the church.

2014 brought Tai Chi classes to Lakeside to improve balance for our seniors. We were glad to partner with the Area Agency on Aging of the State of Florida for this ministry.

Since our Pastor provides his own housing, we decided to rent out the parsonage.

We participated in the "STOP HUNGER NOW" program by putting together over 20,000 meals for those in need.

We have employed Maria Borrelli as a Sunday School Co-Ordinator.

Several of our praise team moved on, so we re-vamped our Praise team this year with the new leadership of Mo Walsh.

On December 23, 2014, the church office and school wing were vandalized and burned. An arson investigation by Palm Beach County Fire Marshals and Federal ATF Agents did not produce any suspects or motives for the fire. The arson was investigated as a Hate Crime due to the nature of the fire and unknown motives of the arsonists. The office was closed for renovation from Dec.23,2014 until August 10,2015. The temporary offices were set up in the Youth Room for the duration of the renovations. Due to the closure of the Sunday School wing, the 8 month loss of revenue forced the closure of Arts and Education International School.



Harvesting food for our Community

CROS Gleanings take place on Saturday mornings from late November through most of July. Sunday mornings from mid-January to mid-April. Large groups can schedule a gleaning event on a Monday or Friday with advance notice. Mango gleaning in June will have some weekday dates.

Gleaning events are typically 8:45am until noon.

Examples of the produce gleaned include: beets, cucumbers, tomatoes, sweet corn, green peppers, potatoes, avocados, mangoes, and whatever else might become available to us. This produce is then distributed free of charge by the Palm Beach County Food Bank to local hunger programs.
