Lakeside United Methodist Church History

Did you know? How many of these do you remember?

Upgrades to our Sanctuary sound system and Audio Hearing Devices were completed in 2015.

Security and fire alarm systems for the renovated office were upgraded with the addition of a video camera monitoring system as part of the renovation.

Additional services added to our schedule for 2015 were a Healing and Communion service on the third Wednesday of each month, and a Praise Gathering which was held every Thursday from August thru December with it being discontinued due to low attendance. Future plans include revamping this service to appeal to those unchurched in our community. With the loss of our Sunday praise band, our Sunday service has now returned to a more traditional format, from its blended format of the recent past.

Unfortunately, due the aging population of our congregation and community support our Community Garden was discontinued this year as well.

A highlight of this year's mission focus was our second packaging event for the Stop Hunger Now Campaign with 10,000 meals being packaged.

In February of 2015 Pastor David Branson led a group of 29 pilgrims from Lakeside UMC and surrounding communities on an 11 day Holy Land (Israel) Tour through EO Tours.

2016, brought many changes to Lakeside: we went to a more traditional service instead of blended. Our courtyard gazebo was removed due to age issues and we plan to replace it in the future. The church buildings received hail damage during a strong storm this year. The trustees are looking into replacement or repair of all of the roofs.

Lighthouse Academy, a school inclusive to autistic children started renting rooms from us for their 1st-8th grade classes.

The Trustees are working on updating one of the Sanctuary air conditioner units.

We provided a Pumpkin Patch in October whose proceeds went completely to local charities.

Next month we will bring you more interesting history of Lakeside UMC.

A FOND FAREWELL

John K. Ashton, Jr., January 28, 1927-February 2, 2017

John K. Ashton, Jr., age 90, passed away peacefully on Thursday, February 2, 2017, surrounded by his family. A few days before, he joyfully celebrated his 90th birthday at a family gathering held in his honor. John was born in New Paltz, NY, on January 28,1927, son of John K. and Elizabeth Ellen (Elliott) Ashton. He grew up in New Paltz, and graduated from New Paltz Central High School in 1945. John married Gloria Margaret Seidel on November 20, 1953.

John enlisted in the Army Air Corps Reserves in 1944, and proudly served his country in the United States Army Air Force from 1945 to 1947. He was stationed in Okinawa during the final months of World War II, where he serviced cargo planes and long-range bombers, preparing for the anticipated invasion of Japan.

In John's words, "Public service has been a primary force in my life forever. My father and mother taught me how. John was an avid deer hunter in local forests with longbow and rifle. Although he rarely returned with supper, he always cherished his woodland walks.

John was confirmed in the Reformed Church of America in New Paltz in 1940, and was a devout member for 77 years. He was ordained as both a Deacon and Elder, and actively supported Church functions throughout the years. John has wintered in Florida since 1988. He became an associate member of Lakeside United Methodist Church, in Lake Worth, FL. He joined the United Methodist Men, and worked at every rummage sale. John was well- liked by all, and was affectionately known as the "Bow-tie Guy."

John served on the Board of Directors of the Murray Hills [condominium] Association, in Lake Worth, Florida, from 1994-2011.

John was preceded in death by his parents, John and Elizabeth, and his beloved wife, Gloria, after 49 years of happy marriage. John is survived by his sister, Ethel Savago, her husband, Peter Savage, his son, Laurence Ashton, daughter, Linda St. Pierre, son Robert Ashton, his wife, Maria Esposito Ashton, nephew PJ Savago, his wife, Dona Henneberger Savago, nephew John Savago, his wife Terri Lee McGarrell Savago, niece Susan Savago- Conklin, her husband, Marc Conklin, his grandchildren, Matthew St. Pierre, Michael St. Pierre, his wife, Sabrina [ales St. Pierre, Andrew St. Pierre, Morgan St. Pierre, Arthur Ashton, and Karina Ashton, and many wonderful grandnieces and grandnephews.
