

Dear Ms. Barbara Russum,

We are excited to share our 2017 Annual Report with you. The report provides a close look at the impact of our core programs as well as the achievements made possible by generous supporters like you.

Now in our 35<sup>th</sup> year, Adopt-A-Family is dedicated to helping Palm Beach County families in crisis achieve stability and self-sufficiency. Thanks to your support, we served 2,046 local families this past year. Your partnership has helped us accomplish so much.

#### The year's highlights:

- An episode of homelessness was prevented or ended for 635 Palm Beach County families.
- Ninety-eight percent (98%) of students in our afterschool program were promoted to the next grade level far exceeding local and national averages for formerly homeless students.
- In the fall of 2016, we were awarded a 2-year grant from the Quantum Foundation to fund an on-site, full-time mental health therapist.
- Through our Service Enriched Housing Program, three clients became first-time homeowners and the program participants eliminated \$35,595.23 in collective debt..
- On June 25, 2017, we embarked on a new housing project development, starting with the demolition of the
  abandoned structures located on the project site; clearing the way for 14 new apartments.
- In October 2017, we earned an 11th consecutive 4-star rating from Charity Navigator a distinction achieved by less than 1% of charities rated nationally.

On behalf of the board of directors, staff, and most importantly, the children and families we serve, thank you for your ongoing investment in Adopt-A-Family's mission.
