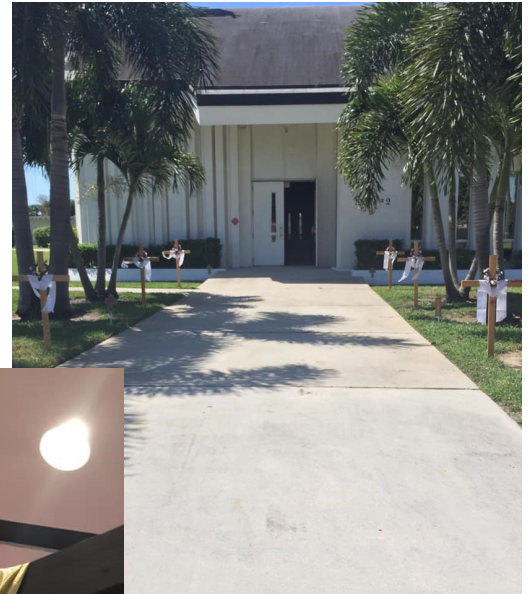

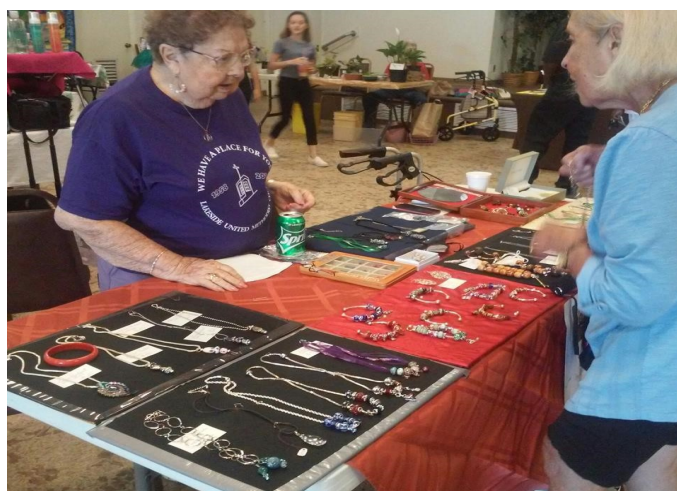

Dr. Thomas S. Brock Draws Parallel On Saddlebags In Methodist Paper

Nashville, Tenn. — The Reverend Thomas S. Brock, D.D., pastor of Calvary Methodist Church, Lake Worth, Fla., is the author of an article entitled "Modern Saddlebags", appearing in the current issue of The Pastor, a professional journal published for the 25,000 Methodist ministers in this country.

Dr. Brock expresses the belief that the modern counterpart of the pioneer preachers who rode into the wilderness with their saddlebags overflowing with good books and religious literature is the preacher who today maintains as part of his church equipment a book table. Such a bookloving minister will continually emphasize the important gains from reading good books. "They are important today as they ever were," he says.

The article in full follows:

"The writer's grandfather and great grandfather were both Methodist preachers, and each give fifty years of service in the pioneering days when saddlebags were a part of every preacher's equipment. The grandson listened with great interest in his boyhood days to some of the uses made of the saddlebags.

"What I brought home in my car, these pioneer ministers put into their saddlebags, in addition to the good books and religious literature which they sold or gave away to their parishioners. These interesting stories about books may have inspired the grandson to have a book table in his church which takes the place of the saddlebags of his sires.

"Many Methodists do not have opportunity to obtain desired religious books because there may not be a religious book store in the community; and the ordinary stationery

store does not carry the supply of religious books that many persons desire. Because of this deficiency, a book table has become a part of our regular ministry.

"We obtain for display, in a prominent place, a fine assortment of books, Bibles, mottoes, and plaques on consignment. These are arranged in an attractive manner in one of the class-rooms of our chapel and within easy access of the congregation as members gather during the week. (During Holy Week the book table is open every morning and evening). No books are sold on Sundays. Many orders are filled for special requests as books advertised in The Christian Advocate which are not on our table. More than a hundred copies of E. Stanley Jones' book, "Abundant Living," have been sold, and more than 300 luminous crosses. One woman who has an apartment house purchased a luminous cross for each apartment, saying that she wanted the people who lived in her house to appreciate the cross and its Christ.

"Each year from October to Easter we hold a Bible Conference every Tuesday morning at 10 o'clock. During the last conference more than 100 Bible handbooks were purchased at the book table, indicating the interest in Bible study.

The Lenten season and the Advent season are appropriate times of the year to have a book table in the church, and we expect to continue this as a part of our regular ministry. There has been no difficulty in finding interested persons who count it a privilege to be responsible for the sale of the books. They are eager to serve Christ in the ministry of books."

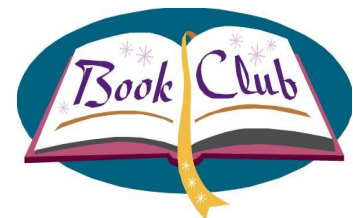

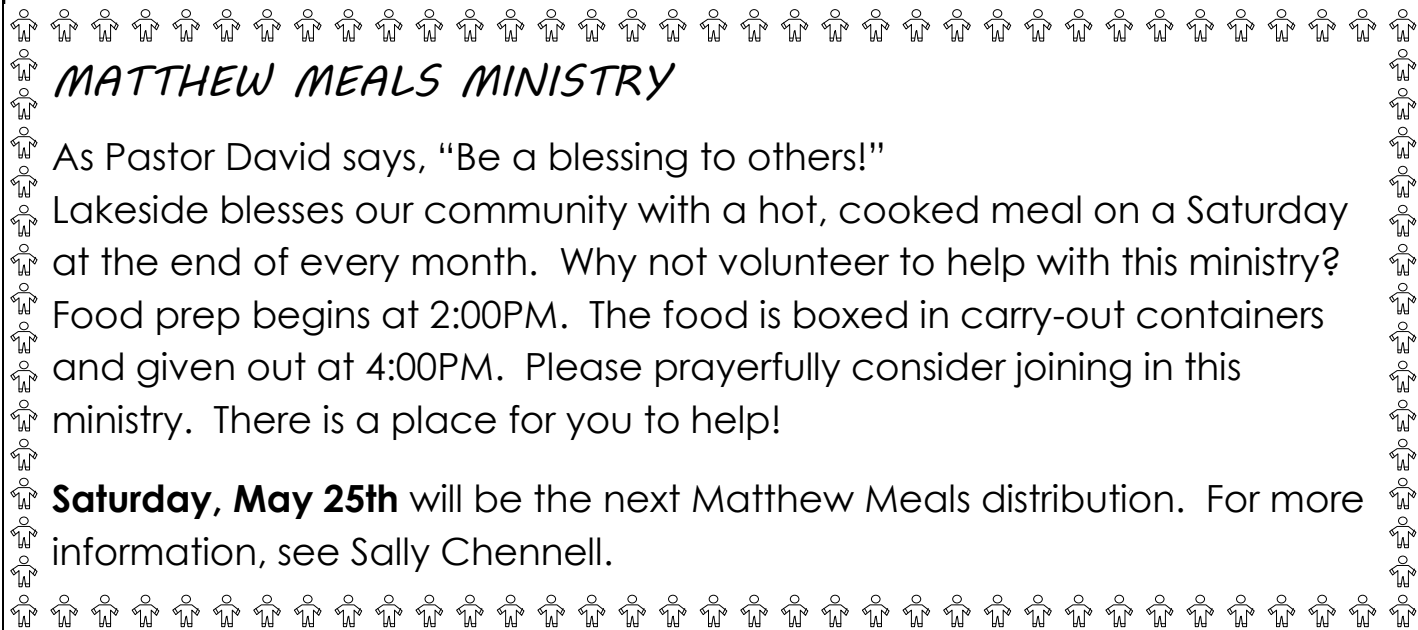
