
**Destiny Harden**

#### HURRICANE SEASON STARTS JUNE 1st ARE YOU READY?

When hurricane season begins

The beginning of the season is the best time to develop your emergency response plans.

Make sure you have supplies to last at least two weeks.

Create a disaster kit to take with you in case of emergency.

The American Red Cross recommends it contains:

- First aid kit and essential medications
- Canned food and manual can opener
- At least 3 gallons of water per person
- Protective clothing, rainwear
- Bedding or sleeping bag
- Battery-powered radio, flashlights, extra batteries
- Special items for infants, elderly, or disabled.

#### Decide where you will go if you must evacuate:

- Prepare in advance to evacuate inland to a low-rise hotel, motel, or a friend's or relative's home outside the storm area.
- Make a list of important phone numbers and pack in disaster kit.
- Plan your route and an alternate- and have a current map of the route on hand. Notify family and friends of your plans.
- If you need special consideration to evacuate (because of age, physical disability, medical needs, etc.), register with the county's civil defense and office of emergency management in advance.
- Discuss emergency plans with agency representative and your physician if you receive home health care or depend upon electrical life-support equipment. Make Arrangements with a hospital if necessary.

Visit your local Publix store to obtain a Hurricane Be Prepared pamphlet or visit publix.com/storm on line to find helpful checklists for emergency supplies and non-perishable foods, links to expert resources, hurricane tracking maps , and more.

As the Boy Scouts say: "Be Prepared". It just may save your life in an emergency.




