

It's the time of year when we all tend to look at our many blessings and consider all the things for which we are thankful. We remind our children at home how blessed they are, and we even share messages on Facebook about being thankful. The children here at the Florida United Methodist Children's Home have much to be thankful for because if your support. In many cases, they are simply thankful to be out of the traumatic environment from they had to be removed. Daniel's one of those children who had to be removed from his home, and has flourished here at the Children's Home.

Daniel grew up in an abusive environment. When he was 12 years old, he watched his mother nearly die from a drug overdose. Without a father in the picture, Daniel was sent to live with his grandmother while his mother tried to get over her addiction. soon he learned that his grandmother was an alcoholic. While his home environment changed, it didn't improve.

His home environment led to poor academic performance, and Daniel soon fell behind in school. He started to blame himself for his situation, thinking that he must be the reason for the actions of his mother and grandmother. School suspensions followed, and so did confrontations with law enforcement. Eventually, Daniel had to be removed from that environment and come to the Children's Home.

Once Daniel started receiving the specialized therapy and support that he needed, he began to see that it wasn't his fault. He learned to accept responsibility for his own actions, and to believe in himself. Now his grades are improving, and he is on track to graduate from high school. Your support provides skilled counseling for children like Daniel, as well as their education, spiritual guidance, and other necessities for a happy and healthy life.

From our children and staff, thank you for your continued love, support, and prayers.
