Letter taken from Compassion International, a Compassion Partnership Facilitator in Kenya, Chukulisa Roba

"Our Mission is God's Mission"

I am reminded of the hymn "To God be the glory" as I share my story of gratitude as a testimony of how God can call, equip and facilitate us to do ministry.

"Why do you want to join Compassion?" was the last interview question I was asked by one of the panelists on April 24, 2018, at the Compassion Kenya office. I answered, "Because I want to be an active participant in the Great Commission." That was all I desired to be, even in my place of work.

Thankfully, I got the opportunity to work with Compassion Kenya as a PF (Partnership Facilitator), serving with 16 partner churches and over 5,000 children and youth. My two years so far have been amazing. Being a young lady of 25 years and the youngest employee by then, he gave me the grace and favor to serve with pastors, bishops and church leaders effectively. Besides that, I come from a marginalized community where women being in frontline ministry is rare. I thank God that I am counted among the few.

I am sincerely grateful to God that I am part of this journey of releasing children from poverty in Jesus' name and for the constant reminder that our mission is God's mission.

I pray that as we journey, we will constantly remember the higher calling that is beyond our line of duty and give ourselves fully to the call to witness to the children and youth entrusted to us.



What does it mean to live a life of radical discipleship today?

Mark, the earliest of the synoptic Gospels, was written almost forty years after the crucifixion. A time when the early church was struggling, troubled and traumatized. Many of those who had walked with Jesus were now imprisoned or dead. The Jewish-Roman War of 66–70 C.E. ended with a destroyed temple and a fractured and frightened community.

In Mark's day and now, Christians are caught in a world of crisis and confusion, a time of uncertainty and fear. There's a struggle going on and evil appears to be winning: injustice reigns, money and greed measure our living and our dying, divisions deepen and hope is sometimes hard to find. Then and now, part of the crisis is the church's complicity, complacency, and silence in a world where so much has gone wrong.

Then, as now, Christians were asking, what does it mean to be a disciple of this Jesus, crucified and raised? At this Mission study, we'll delve into these questions. Learn how the women in Mark, though often unnamed, are prominent among Jesus' followers.

Ash Wednesday, February 17 this year, is the beginning of the Lent-Easter-Pentecost-cycle of the Christian year. The marking of ashes in the shape of a cross on the foreheads of believers as a reminder of mortality and belonging is how Christians begin the forty-day journey of Lent leading to Easter and ultimately the Day of Pentecost. However, as COVID-19 cases continue to soar, churches are left with the task of re-envisioning these liturgical markers while keeping faithful to their importance and meaning in the community of faith. Therefore, we have decided to have a virtual service.

Dear Lakeside Family and Friends,

I hope you all are safe and well.

We are continuing to allow you to join together for in person worship on Sundays at 10:00 a.m.

We are observing facial covering and sanitizing guidelines from the CDC and the UM Conference. We will be seating with social distancing in mind in designated seats that you will be escorted to by an usher.
