How to Zoom to engage and revitalize your Units

Over this past year we have had to learn new ways to connect. Many of us are struggling and feel the frustrations of meeting in person and abiding by the Covid -19 guidelines. As United Methodist Women we know the importance of fellowship as we participate in learning about global missions and those in our own communities. We have been hampered with our usual fund-raising activities to support our mission of helping women, children, and youth. We are limited in living out our vision of Faith, Hope and Love in Action.

Roadblocks to increasing and keeping members Engaged

Younger and working women have busy schedules and little time for the traditional meetings we have held. They are less likely to spend a full day at an event or half day at a Unit meeting that may have a special program. Many grand-mothers who have been loyal members are now taking care of their grandchildren during the day while their parents are at work or they may be caring for a parent or spouse who cannot be left alone due to health issues.

Questions about using virtual settings for Meetings

How would Zoom help your unit grow? How can using this video phone tool keep us connected and engaged while offering opportunity for raising the needed money for our missions? What has been holding you back from using this technology? Does Zoom have to replace all gatherings and activities? How can the virtual setting help us to be the best we can be while in the comfort of our own homes?

Answers about using virtual settings for Meetings

Your units can grow when you have a virtual meeting in the evening which would include those women mentioned in the previous section about roadblocks. Many are already using this format with their jobs and would gladly spend time sharing with other women this way. Learning basic skills will increase your confidence and help you grow both spiritually and emotionally as you share with others and are able to encourage them to do the same. Virtual meetings can be limited to business meetings, deciding, and preparing for fund raising or social activities, training leaders in the different positions, or just a simple prayer gathering, or book review get together. If someone doesn't have Internet capabilities, you could have someone who does buddy up with them. Most of our churches have Internet where several could join and stay socially distant while others are on Zoom. The possibilities are endless.

Training Opportunities

Training members to be unafraid and willing to try find something they are unfamiliar with is not an easy task. As a way of support, your District is providing you with a series of training using the Zoom format. Kim Wendt, Vice President of Atlantic Central District has graciously agreed to help us learn the best ways to use Zoom. Depending on your ability and need there will be three sessions listed below. You may want to attend one or more sessions depending on your experience.

Session 1 – Beginner: learn the controls you need to use to navigate a Zoom meeting as a participant such as chat box, reactions, audio and video settings, etc.

Session 2 – Intermediate: learn how to host, cohost, create an invite email, record, share your screen to show a document, PowerPoint, or a video, and set up a meeting with registered attendees.

Session 3 – Advanced: learn ways of enhancing your meetings using breakout rooms, polls, spotlighting, closed captioning, file sharing.

Cost of Zoom

You need a paid Zoom account to host a meeting that is longer than 40 minutes. While some Units don't have it in their budgets to purchase a Zoom account, your District, is offering you the opportunity to schedule meetings through its account, subject to District events and meetings. A monthly calendar of events will be sent to all Units to be see available dates and times.


