

Engage in spiritual practices and grow in faith during Advent.

There's a difference between standing and looking down a road and putting one foot in front of the other and walking down the road. That's the premise of this thematic Advent study for individuals or small groups. Instead of merely reading and talking about growing in faith this season, *Travel the Highways of Advent* uses each chapter to show you how to take what you learn from the Bible and apply it to everyday, practical life experiences, nurturing your faith development and spiritual growth as you journey down the pathway to Jesus.

An Epic Year of Gratitude and Praise

The only way through hard times is ... well, through them.
You can't go over, under or around difficult seasons.
You simply plow through, one step at a time.
Last year was hard. And that didn't go away
because the calendar flipped to 2021.
But there is still good in the world.

This month, is another letter of gratitude which is more of a sermon by a pastor. His name is Pastor Don Baker. He used to have a church here in West Palm Beach. He and his family have moved many times as the Lord has led them. Hopefully, his message will speak to you too.

My pessimist self looks at this past weekend and realizes how adept our culture is at secularizing all of life. We have taken a holiday set aside to give thanks to God and turned it into a day of gluttony and a kick-off to a month of lusting.

My optimist self counters that at many tables God was praised, and assures me that during the next four weeks I can choose a path that is different than the world's--different, even, than the one I walked last year.

As I observe the frenzy of purchasing gifts, I am reminded of the strangest thank-you note I have ever read. It was a note written by the Apostle Paul to the church in Philippi to say thank you for a financial gift that had been brought to him by Epaphroditus, a member of that church. It's an odd note, first of all, because Paul waits until the end of his letter to even mention the gift (my mother always taught me to lead with that). Then, when he does finally mention the gift, he says that he didn't really need it, even though it was clear to everyone else that he did. Paul was actually in prison at the time, so you know he needed help.

Like everything else he wrote, Paul's thank you note contains a whole lot of wisdom. Wisdom I'd like to share with you as we face this season of giving and getting.

The note is found in Philippians 4:10-19:

I rejoiced greatly in the Lord that at last you renewed your concern for me. Indeed, you were concerned, but you had no opportunity to show it. 11 I am not saying this because I am in need, for I have learned to be content whatever the circumstances. 12 I know what it is to be in need, and I know what it is to have plenty. I have learned the secret of being content in any and every situation, whether well fed or hungry, whether living in plenty or in want. 13 I can do all this through him who gives me strength.

14 Yet it was good of you to share in my troubles. 15 Moreover, as you Philippians know, in the early days of your acquaintance with the gospel, when I set out from Macedonia, not one church shared with me in the matter of giving and receiving, except you only; 16 for even when I was in Thessalonica, you sent me aid more than once when I was in need. 17 Not that I desire your gifts; what I desire is that more be credited to your account. 18 I have received full payment and have more than enough. I am amply supplied, now that I have received from Epaphroditus the gifts you sent. They are a fragrant, an acceptable sacrifice, pleasing to God. 19 And my God will meet all your needs according to the riches of his glory in Christ Jesus.

From this thank-you note, I would like to point out four principles:

- 1. Giving is an opportunity to put feelings into action. In verse 10, Paul says he knew the Philippians cared about him, but care without action is incomplete. Their gift was a way to give expression to what had been, until then, only a feeling.
- 2, My gifts will not fill the real need. Although Paul seems to be saying in verses 11-13 that he didn't need the money, he did need it, and I'm sure he used it. However, Paul wants to make clear that contentment comes from within our hearts and not from anything that people are able to give us. The secret of contentment is God's strength working through us.
- 3. Giving connects me to another person. Paul says in verse 14 that the gift has made them partners because they have now shared his troubles. Through their giving, they have sat beside Paul in his prison cell. He goes on to say in verses 15 and 16 that the gifts they sent have created a special bond between them.
- 4. Giving enhances life for the giver. In verse 17, Paul reveals that his real desire is not what the Philippians' money will do for him, but what giving it does for them. It gave them the satisfaction of knowing that a need had been met because they got to be God's means of meeting it (verse 18), the offering had been received by God as an acceptable and pleasing sacrifice (verse 18), and their gift had unlocked God's storehouse of provisions for future needs (verse 19).

My prayer is that this Christmas will be different and your giving will bring glory to Christ.
