#### "THY KINGDOM COME"

An excerpt from Global Ministries:

In the shadow of the Himalaya, this missionary couple is improving health outcomes for Nepal's neediest.

Methodist missionaries Mark and Deidre Zimmerman embody a commitment to Nepal marked by a deep love for the people and a passion for empowering their rise from struggle.

Dr. Zimmerman first caught the bug as a short-term volunteer in West Africa while studying at Dartmouth Medical School, where he earned his M.D. in 1982. "I became transfixed by the vibe of the developing world," he says. "I made a promise to myself to return once I'd been fully qualified as a medical internist."

In 1986, Dr. Zimmerman embarked on a sort-term medical missions assignment with Untied Mission to Nepal, a small, primarily Hindu nation landlocked by India and China. "The medicine, the people, the sense of walking into a novel – this led me to extend my stay several times," he says.

Since 2016, Dr. Zimmerman has served Patan Hospital as a professor and senior consultant. Many of his patients come to him from a place of desperation, often from far-off rural villages. Sometimes they have sold a goat, a field, or even a farm to afford the journey. "I listen to their stories, touch their sick bodies, and walk with them over uneven ground," he says. "It still seems an adventure, even 35 years later.

Dr. and Mrs. Zimmerman met in Kathmandu after Mrs. Zimmerman began working with United Mission to Nepal's Nutrition Project in 1997 under the auspices of the Church Missionary School in Ireland.
